Q1

Mention the scientific research regarding the beneficial properties of fig and olives together.

Answer

Q2

What are the major points of differences between the Muslims and the non-Muslims concentrated on?

Answer

Explain the effect of Hajj on a Muslim's life.

Answer

Allah (swt) has made Hajj (pilgrimage) an Islamic obligation on every sane, adult, free, capable Muslim man or woman for at least once in his/her lifetime.

The idea to bring every Muslim to the most holy place on the surface of the planet, during the Most Holy 10 days of the year so that their good deeds can be multiplied many folds is a renovation of the Muslims life by reminding them of the fact that death is a reality of our time.

Dressing in Al Ihram is symbolising the piece of cloth in which a dead body is shrouded and covered, and the circumambulation of the Ka'bah is conforming to the movement in the universe. Every single creation in the universe is moving in that direction, and this conformity can bring a lot of blessings to the human being.
